TAIKO VERBAL NOTATION

Taiko is an oral tradition. This means that songs are taught through vocal sounds instead of through the use of written notation. Each kind of drumbeat has a different sound that represents it.

- 1 loud beat on the drum skin is DON
- 2 loud beats on the drum skin is **DORO**
- 1 soft beat on the drum skin is tsu
- 2 soft beats on the drum skin is tsuku
- 1 beat on the rim of the drum is KA
- 2 beats on the rim of the drum is KARA
- 1 rest (space) is SU
